Parenting in the Faith

Please follow these guidelines to maintain a safe environment for all.

If You are Sick, Please Stay Home.



If you have these symptoms that are consistent with COVID-19: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea. Has anyone in your household had these symptoms in the past 72 hours? Have you been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 within the past 14 days? Have you taken fever reducing medication in the past 24 hours? Have you traveled by flight within the past 14 days?

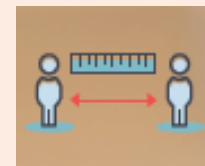


Follow Best Hygienic Practices. Use of hand sanitizer or bathrooms to wash hands. Avoid touching your face. Cover coughs and sneezes.



Wear a Mask.

For the protection of the members of our community, face coverings are **REQUIRED** for all attendees, including children over the age of two. We have been informed that members within our community have tested positive for COVID-19, although had shown no symptoms. Wearing a mask is one of the most effective ways that we can avoid the spread of the virus.



Practice Social Distancing.

Remain 6 feet away from others not in the same household.



Enter the communicated entrances and exits

Enter through Door 2 or 10. Every effort is being made to help the flow of traffic to go in one direction. Each are sanitized regularly. Look for the designated bathrooms that can be used. Hand sanitizer is available.
